THE VOTE OF THANKS

- 1. The Vote of Thanks is a short speech by an appointed member of a group to thank a guest speaker who has given a presentation to the group.
- 2. The person chosen will have been selected by the Head of the group eg Housemaster.
- 3. If possible, the person chosen to give the vote of thanks, contact the guest speaker and ask some specifics of the content of the speech.
- 4. If the speaker has never seen the guest speaker before introduce yourself at the beginning of the evening as a matter of courtesy.
- 5. During the speech listen very carefully and write down pertinent points to include in your vote of thanks.
- 6. After the speech, when confirmed by the MC, give your response.
- 7. As an introduction be accurate in the person's name and inform of the pleasure given in being able to give the vote of thanks.
- 8. Be brief but include the major themes of the guest's speech. At the conclusion ask for audience acclamation and present a small gift or memento of the evening. Shake the hand of the guest signifying a conclusion to your role for the evening.
- 9. If the guest presents a gift to you present it to the audience. The gift will then be handed to the appropriate person for display.

Make sure the guest is looked after during the evening.
