
- Adjectives Checklist

Curiosity and Exploration Inventory

- 1. I actively seek as much information as I can in new situations
- 2. I am the type of person who really enjoys the uncertainty of everyday life etc....

Trait Curiosity was established over two factors:

- Embracing: Willingness to embrace the novel, uncertain and unpredictable nature of everyday life
- Stretching: Motivation to seek out and knowledge and new experiences





Adjectives Checklist: Self Assessment


Start of Day One: Students presented with a checklist of fifty adjectives. Circled the ones which best described them at the moment.

- 30 which are indicative of curiosity
- 10 which are contra-indicative of curiosity
- 10 which help disguise the purpose of the checklist

End of Day Two: Same checklist completed by students.

Curiosity score was calculated on difference.








Adjectives Checklist: Teacher Observation

- 6 Teachers took observations using the Adjectives Checklist
- 8 Observations in total were taken over the two days
- Average curiosity scores were created for each day
- Scores from Day 1 to Day 2 compared
