## Definition of Terms

- <u>Literacy Events</u>: Heath (1982a), sequential activity with individuals in which print is interpreted/created, where listening, speaking, reading, writing is part of the participants' conversations
- <u>Role/Identity</u>: "perspective-taking" (Gee, 2004, p. 52)
- <u>Small book-discussion groups</u>: physical context or affinity space (Gee, 2004)
- <u>Masculine Hegemony</u>: Dutro (2003), many versions of masculinities displayed within a context & one holding cultural authority at a time
- <u>Researcher-Participant</u>: participant-observer

## Definition of Terms (cont.)

- <u>Text-to-self</u>: own lives
- <u>Text-to-text</u>: assigned texts & other books
- <u>Text-to-world</u>: events occurred around them
- <u>Efferent Stance</u>: Rosenblatt (2005), what is retained after the reading event
- <u>Aesthetic Stance</u>: Rosenblatt (2005), readers feelings, intuitions, focuses on what is being lived through during the reading event
