






The Philadelphia Story






- Peggy Noonan's recent column in "The Wall Street Journal" entitled "America Needs More Gentleman"

- Noonan focuses on the classic film "The Philadelphia Story," in which the character played by Jimmy Stewart has the opportunity to take advantage of the character played by Katharine Hepburn.

About Woodberry:

- All Boys, All Boarding. 400 boys in grades 9-12.
- A vision to develop young men of **intellectual thoroughness** and **principled integrity** who are able and eager to serve as leaders, learners, and citizens.
- A vision that boys will develop curiosity and adaptability, enduring self-confidence and genuine humility.
- The deep relationships among boys and between boys and faculty are derived from the student-run honor system and a culture of shared academic and nonacademic experiences.



The Woodberry Schedule

- Faculty belief that the Woodberry experience should be two contiguous chapters: 9th and 10th grades and then 11th and 12th grades
- Two schedules run side-by-side: One primarily for ninth and tenth graders, the other for eleventh and twelfth graders.
- Younger classes meet five times a week for 45 minutes.
- Older classes meet three times a week: Once for 45 minutes, twice for 90 minutes.
- Exceptions: Music classes meet in the 5x45 schedule, regardless of age or level. All science classes meet 45/90/90.
- This is year two of the schedule. One adjustment after first year was adding back in dedicated consultation times.



The Senior Meeting

Meet with every senior in small groups of 4-5 for 45 minutes. Seeking answers to four questions:

- 1. What do you value most about your experience at Woodberry Forest (previously Randolph School)?
- 2. What is your biggest regret or disappointment? What would you do differently if you were to do it all over again?
- 3. Who have been your best teachers and coaches?
- 4. Who have been your worst teachers and coaches?




